# Burbage Theatre Co announces their Winter Rep: The Rhode Island Premiere of Will Eno's THOM PAIN [BASED ON NOTHING] and Kenneth Lonergan's THIS IS OUR YOUTH

PAWTUCKET, RI (January 10, 2019)\_ The Burbage Theatre Co announces the third portion of their Eighth Season (2018-2019) with a dynamic Winter Repertory series, running from January 18 to February 24 at TEN31 Productions (249 Roosevelt Avenue, Pawtucket, RI).

Burbage's Winter Rep begins with the Rhode Island premiere of **THOM PAIN [BASED ON NOTHING]** by Will Eno directed by Vince Petronio, a finalist for the 2005 Pulitzer prize *Thom Pain* is a 70-minute monologue performed by Jeff Church, opening for previews on January 18th. **THIS IS OUR YOUTH** by Kenneth Lonergan directed by Allison Crews opening on for previews on January 26th.

"Who can stand the most life and still smile?" Thom Pain asks us. Our Winter Rep, a pair of profound contemporary dark comedies, will force audiences to confront this most difficult and insinuative question," says Artistic Director Jeff Church. "With a careful hand, these plays very simply, truthfully, and oftentimes hilariously, chart the trajectory of people in free fall, through rock bottom, to a state of reflection, reminding us that life is never as it seems, and often doesn't go according to plan.

When we're young and untethered in the world, victim to life's unpredictability, we desperately struggle to find meaning. We endeavor to understand what has happened when our reality confronts and contradicts the expectations of what our lives should be. What do we do? How do we cope? Is there nothing to be done? Do we hide behind our privilege and drugs? Do we accept our lives for what they are, being out of our control? Or is it our fault when things don't go the way they should have? These plays remind us that on top of all of this, we still have to live. Live through the wild uncertainty, ourselves contributing to life's entropy. Both plays bleed with real life, real hurt, real struggle, and the real relatable beauty and resultant humor of people attempting make sense of their lives. These people are not outfitted for this world, but they are trying."

Production dates for Burbage's Winter Rep Series vary and alternate over six weekends in January and February (Jan 18 - Feb 24).

THOM PAIN runs from January 18 to February 24, and THIS IS OUR YOUTH runs from January 26 to February 23 at TEN31 Productions.

Tickets are \$25 (General admission), \$15 (Students); preview performances are \$15. High school students received free admission to any performance that isn't SOLD OUT.
